Without a doubt, I had set some goals for MYC that will have to wait. Late December storms that tear docks and attenuators apart and something called "Make Up Air" will cause Commodores to lose sleep and put goals on hold. Nevertheless, our club remains on solid financial ground and has more than weathered these "storms".

During my time as Commodore I learned a lot about MYC. For starters, MYC is a lot of different things to a lot of different members. Our membership is very diverse and that is among the most outstanding things about MYC. I'd like to think that while I was Commodore I listened to the membership and the decisions of our BOD reflected the desires of our membership. Without a doubt, the major statement of my tenure as Commodore, and the tenure of this BOD, will be the upcoming vote on the bylaw changes.

Regarding the bylaw changes. Each regular member will soon receive a first class letter/proxy regarding the proposed bylaw changes. The proposed changes are a culmination of member comments, requests and common sense updating of the laws that govern our club. The primary proposed changes focus on three areas. 1) A change in membership structure that does away with boat ownership as an element of membership status, 2) to allow electronic notice, if preferred, to the membership as official notice (replacing first class mail) and, 3) clarification of the number of votes it takes to change the bylaws. I would also be remiss if I did not note that in reviewing the existing bylaws, we learned that as currently constituted, associate members are not allowed to attend meetings. I am not kidding. Of course, we are amending that clause too, and if approved, all members, regardless of status, will be allowed to attend meetings.

Last, but not least, I need to thank several of you for your dedication, counsel and support over the last year. I was, and we are blessed, to have a staff that, under Kim's management, continues to get better and better. I thank our BOD for being willing to take on projects such as the bylaw amendments, and endure my long meetings. (and without making direct comments to me.) I thank our membership in general, and all the Andy Bos' of the club that don't

know how to say no. And my final thank you goes to my Vice Commodore Larry Taunt. He served me 100 times better than I served Commodore Price, when I was his Vice Commodore. I rarely had to ask Larry to do something, because he was already doing it. For context, I just checked my email box and there are over 600 emails between Larry and myself over the last year. Sorry Larry, and thank you again. Our club will be in good hands with you as Commodore.

Thank you all, it has been an honor serving as your Commodore.



MYC RACE OFFICERS GO ABOVE AND BEYOND

On Sep 24-25, several MYC members served in key roles at the Midwest Qualifier for the Cressy National High School Championship. This two day event, held at Grand Rapids Yacht Club, was raced on Laser Radials and Laser Full Rigs. This regatta determined which 6 high school sailors from the Midwest would advance to compete at the 2016 Cressy National Championship. This year, 51 sailors traveled from as far away as Missouri, Kentucky, Illinois, Wisconsin and Minnesota to compete.

MYC member Scott Corder served as Principal Race Officer for this event, while Jon and Jessica Ledsworth served as primary Mark Set and helped manage the start/finish lines. Larry Taunt served as an on-the-water Judge monitoring Rule 42. Scott is a Certified Regional Race Officer. Jon, Jessica and Larry are Certified Club Race Officers. Together, they were 4 of the 7 Certified Officials at this event.

This calls attention to something many members may not know, namely that MYC's Race Officials are frequently called upon by other yacht clubs to help administer races at other venues, especially at events where the stakes are high such as national qualifiers and Class championships. These other organizations seek out MYC's Race Officers because of their reputation for providing high quality racing - and this is the direct result of two things.

The first reason is the skill and competence of our Race Officials. The fact is, there are only 12 Race Officers in the entire western half of Michigan's lower peninsula that are currently US Sailing Certified... and 6 (HALF!) of these Certified Officials are members of MYC. Furthermore, 2 of the 4 advanced-level Regional Race Officers on this list are members of MYC. No other single club in Michigan comes anywhere close to having this many trained, Certified Race Officials among its membership!

To be US Sailing Certified, Race Officials must go through abundant training and testing, must compile a lengthy track record of running quality regattas, and must be nominated and approved by several key people within US Sailing, which is the national governing body for the sport. This process insures that each Race Official can and will deliver the highest quality experience to racing sailors.

The second reason other sailing organizations seek out our Race Officers is their proven dedication and eagerness to give sailors great racing experiences.

While few people ever witness RC efforts off the water, the reality is that for each and every hour spent on the water, Race Officials spend at least 2 or more additional hours on pre and post race responsibilities.



This year's Midwest Cressy Qualifier is an excellent example of the extra effort required to run a quality event. Leading up to the event, Scott spent 2-3 weeks working with the regatta host and drafting the event's Sailing Instructions with the help of ISSA Officials and others across the country. Jon and Jessica spent hours reviewing plans, prepping gear and driving back and forth to Grand Rapids on multiple days. Larry went through 2+ hours of intensive training specific to Rule 42 in addition to several hours of pre-study for his role as a Judge. Collectively, these MYC members invested days (not hours) working to make sure the event would be a success. In the end, the widespread consensus was that this was one of the best Midwest Cressy Qualifier regattas in many years.

Because we have so many qualified and dedicated Race Officers in our midst, and because they spend countless hours behind the scenes to do good work, it is easy to take for granted the high quality of racing we enjoy here at MYC. The math is simple: the vast majority of yacht clubs in Michigan don't have ANY certified Race Officers – and most don't have anyone who has received even basic training on how to run races.

Please keep all this in mind the next time you are racing at MYC – and also take a moment to thank our member Race Officials for the abundant time and energy they invest in delivering the high quality racing they provide to MYC members and countless other sailors around the region.




