COMMODORE'S COMMENTS:

September is upon us and it is unfortunately the time of year we must start thinking about putting the summer toys away. One of the long-standing traditions of the Muskegon Yacht Club has been Haul Out and Launch days. These days are much more than simply the putting in and taking out of the boats. These days have been the official kick-off and closing of the summer season of our club for generations. We paint, clean, get equipment in and out of storage. We greet and say good-bye to friends who we haven't seen or won't see until the "season" returns. Unfortunately, this tradition is changing a bit but, I hope the spirit of it continues.

I was notified a few weeks ago, by Torresen Marine that due to concerns of their insurance carrier they would no longer be able to provide us with the onsite haul out and launch services that they have provided for us for many years. After verifying that the cost of bringing in another contractor would be prohibitive, our members who store with us were quickly and directly notified so that they could make alternative storage arrangements. We will still be able to provide storage for mast and boats on trailers but boats requiring a crane will no longer be able to be accommodated. While the loss of revenue is not helpful to the club, given that we are down to storing only about 25 boats, the financial hit is not critical. In truth, I am more concerned about the loss of the tradition than I am about the revenue. There are some benefits to this. We have occasionally had some environmental concerns raised with the boat storage (sanding of bottoms, chemicals etc.) that will no longer be of concerns. Winter parking, snow plowing, parking lot configuration, etc., will be much simplified. It also allows us to rethink some things in terms of usage of the property with a different, if not a clean slate.

I would like to thank Torresen Marine and the Torresen family for the many years of service and the many things they have done and continue to do for the Muskegon Yacht Club. They have been an important part of our past, and I trust they will continue to be in the future.

In other news, our new contractor has completed the installation of the gangways, raising of the finger piers, and additional repairs and reinforcement of the attenuator. They have recommended some additional measures for the system to further dampen the wave motion on the attenuator and hopefully prevent or minimize damage from future storms. The board and Dock and Yard committees will be evaluating these recommendations both for practicality and cost. The rise in the water levels, and the modifications to our marina that it has forced, has been expensive. We need to manage our resources while at the same time protecting our assets. There are no easy solutions here and we will be doing a careful evaluation.

We will soon see the return of our "off Season" activities. The awards banquet, the extremely popular wine dinners, football on the flat screens, firing up the fireplace, and maybe some ice boating (hopefully) this season. Some of you will be heading south for the winter. Some of you will be heading north to the ski resorts. MYC unlike most yacht clubs is open year-round with Chef Adam providing his outstanding fare, and our bartenders providing delicious beverages. General Manager Kim is already taking reservations for holiday parties so please contact her before your preferred date is taken.

The current term of the flag officers and board are winding down. Per our bylaws, the past Commodore has formed a nominating committee to fill the open board positions. This slate will be presented at the annual board meeting on Friday October 13th for election. If you are interest in joining the board of directors, please contact Sam Nedeau and make it known to him. The committee will review and present the recommended slate for approval by the membership. This is important. MYC has made significant progress but we continue to face challenges with our aging facilities, staffing, increasing cost, and maintenance of our marina. Having a strong board is critical to facing these challenges. We are very blessed to have a dedicated and knowledgeable board who have guided the club through some significant challenges over the last several years. I have been proud to serve with them. It is critical that we maintain this quality and dedication to keep the club moving forward. Your involvement is key. Volunteer for the board, join a committee, get involved.

Enjoy the fall sailing season! We still have a lot of racing to do! Governor's Cup is this weekend, Anchorage Cup next, and our fall series after that. Wednesday night racing continues through early October. It is not time to put the toys away just yet.


