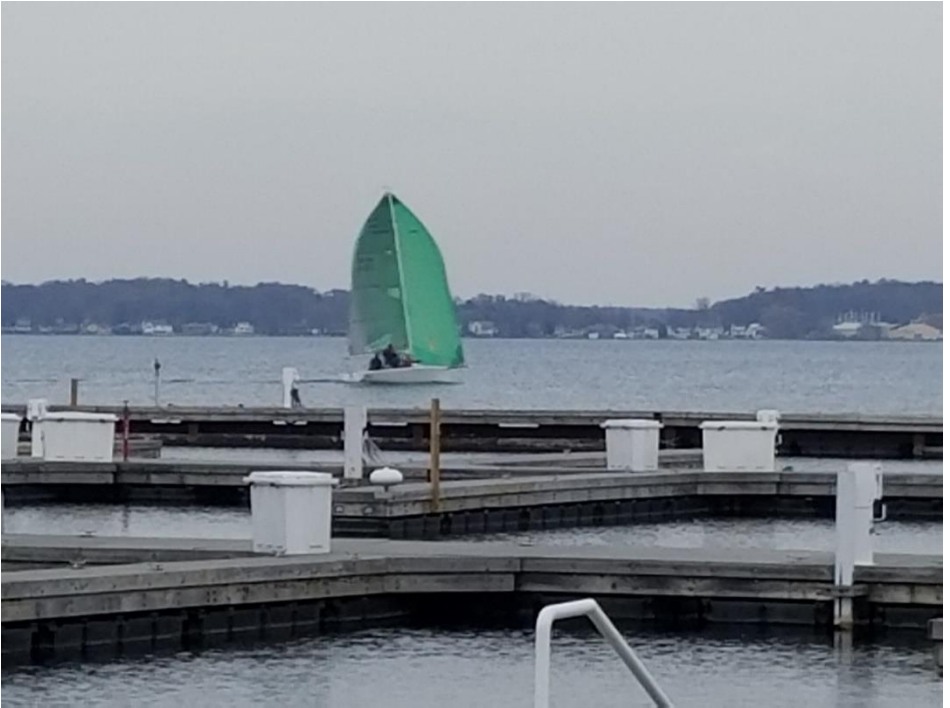

COMMODORE'S COMMENTS:

It saddens me to start this month's report with the recent passing of Jim McColl on my mind. Jim was a true friend to all that knew him and a champion sailor. Jim was a three-time Commodore at MYC in the mid 70's (one of only two ever at MYC). Jim was also the founder of the Governor's Cup Regatta at MYC. The first year of the regatta he had a 10 piece marching band from Mona Shores High School perform and Governor Blanchard flew in for the event. Jim was an active racer in his younger years, transitioned to a trawler and then had a Boston Whaler helping the race committee for many years. He leaves behind a long legacy at MYC, a club he dearly loved and the sailing community at large. The Board of Directors and I would like to offer our sincere condolences to his wife Linda and family. Jim will be greatly missed.

Although the club was closed for twelve of our business days in the middle of January, we had a very busy month at MYC. The staff performed a top to bottom cleaning and much-needed repair and painting work during the closing. The staff and volunteers do a great job every year, and this year was no exception. We were open the first week of January and had a great week with a New Year's Eve Party and we were open New Year's Day for bowl games too. Race & Regatta Committee Report:

Our newly formed RRC (Race Regatta Committee) is happy to report that the 2018 sailing season should be stellar. In addition to the annual standard events, we are hosting the start of the Tripp Memorial (Muskegon to Milwaukee, June 20th). This will be in the middle of what we are starting to refer to as MYC Race Week (we will see if that name sticks) This week will kick off with the Governor's Cup (June 16-17) followed by the Tripp Memorial and then the finish of the Trans Michigan (June 22nd, starting earlier in the morning this year). The RRC has been working with both the GRSC and the MBYC to join forces and combine these three events into one significant event. We are very optimistic that this will be fun for all and hope all of our MYC racers will participate.

Additionally, we are working with GRSC on improving their Commodore's Cup and bringing that race back to relevance. Lastly, there are two other significant changes for 2018. July 4th falls on a Wednesday this year and as noted, we have moved the Governor's Cup from Labor Day weekend to June. After good discussion, we decided to move the Craig Powell Memorial to the Saturday of Labor Day weekend. Also, we decided to hold July 4th racing earlier in the day, (3:00 or 4:00 PM tbd) and that the July 4th racing will be a standalone event, not counting for the summer series.

We have a very strong core RRC, but we welcome new committee members. We will be announcing the date and time of our February meeting soon. Please join us.

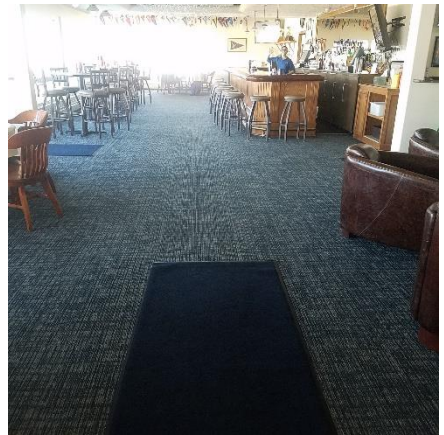
Back Room - Floors were scrubbed and sealed, walls & ceiling were scrubbed, and everything was reorganized!

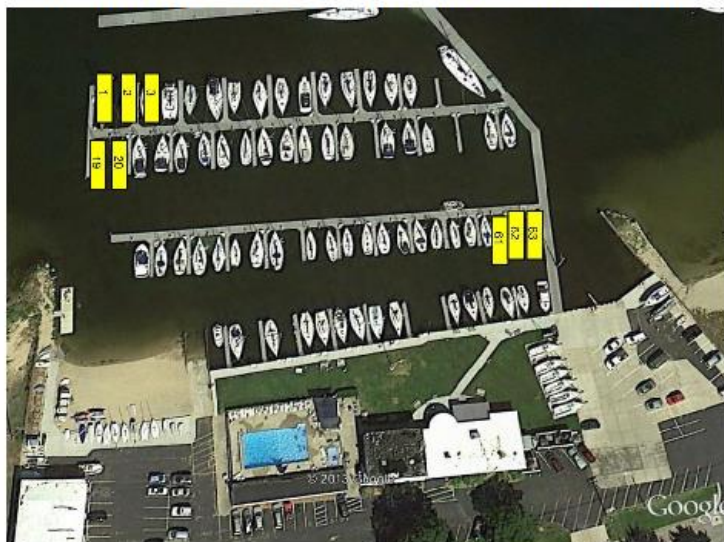

In Memory of Jim McColl National Champion Helmsman

First, to Linda and the entire McColl family I very sorry about your loss. I'm going to miss a friend and mentor but can't imagine your feelings, please hang in there and let us know if you need anything. I find as my sailing friends pass on it is beyond important to keep their stories and impacts alive so we can hopefully follow in their footsteps, it's a long sailing tradition. Now, while I'm sure some old timers will have much better stories of Jim than this 36 year old, I wanted you to know the impact he had on me and I'm sure others.

The year is 1997 when the Bomberys with their Catalina 30 (Gambit) decided to make a run at the first Catalina 30 National Championships in the great lakes since 1980. Hosted in Holland, this regatta is as big of a deal as it gets for the once mighty most produced "big sailboat" racing fleet. After our many years at MYC (since 1984), by this point our crew was my father, mother, sister and I doing almost solely Jib and Main as a family. The spinnaker only saw the light of day for the across the lake races on this family weekend racer. We obviously needed more crew for a national regatta. My father's thought process was the family could run the boat we know, but we need a helmsman. This was an easy decision as there has been one constant competitor, mentor and friend since my family joined MYC in 1984, and that was Jim McColl. To be honest, I was only three years old in 1984, and my memories don't go back that far anymore. However, as my parents will tell you, Jim was the first to welcome us to the club in 1984 and became a great family friend. As far back as I can remember it was the Bombery S2 7.9 (Toybota) vs the McColl S2 7.9 (Cheers) and the Bombery Catalina 30 (Gambit) vs the McColl Pearson 32 (WhatchaMcCollit). Jim of course accepted our offer and it was off to Holland.

When we arrived in Holland there was immediately confusion since only us and eventual Queen's Cup (1998) winner and National Champion (2011, 2013, 2016) Rag Doll, out of Milwaukee, were the only two registered spinnaker boats. The national regatta rules state there must be three for a fleet. However, there were plenty of Jib and Main boats registered so we joined that fleet. I clearly remember Jim and my father being disappointed but NOT, because this is what we did with our families nearly every weekend. Race one was on a light air Friday night and the Bombery crew watched in amazement as our ace helmsman proceeded to lap all the Catalina 34s, who were also having a national

regatta, and approached the finish line without another Catalina 30 rounding the mark prior yet. The wind died and within a football field from the finish line (but still drifting that direction!) the race committee abandoned the race. We were mad yet far from deflated, we put the fleet on notice. Jim and his crew never looked back over the weekend winning every race, albeit by smaller margins. We had some good regattas over the years but this has to be our proudest family sailing moment (just look at our reaction in the picture below), I'm glad we can include Jim in that family.

My point here is Jim was a lot of things to a lot of people, but maybe you don't know or forgot he is a national champion sailor also. To my kids he was "daddy's nice friend who looks like Santa." I always responded to them that I only hope I can join him someday and look like the absolutely picture perfect older sailor. Now that my wife Melissa, our kids Tess and Ian, and I own that same Gambit, we will always pass down the legend of the national champion helmsman of MYC. Since 1997 we've had a plaque mounted inside the boat to remember, and Jim's name in permanently engraved on the back of the Catalina 30 Nationals trophy.

Thank you Jim, thank you for helping me love sailing, thank you for the memories. Come ask me about finally convincing Jim to race the 1998 Queen's Cup on WhatchaMcCollit to avoid Bantu's section for another good story, if you need another memory.
