COMMODORE'S COMMENTS:

In like a Lion, out like a lamb......Wow, can't believe it is March already! With March being such a changeable month, in which we can see warm spring-like temperatures or late-season snowstorms, the weather has become seasonably warm. My favorite part is, it's staying lighter out longer now. I personally flipped the breaker last week to kill the power to the dock bubblers, as the ice has slowly disappeared on Muskegon Lake and has become open water.

Member, Rob Rafson, sent me an interesting article recently, explaining what we are seeing and what is going on right now with the weather. There has been a "Sudden Stratospheric Warming Event" that has fractured the polar vortex in two recently. This has allowed for a ridge of high pressure to amplify Northwest North America and bring unseasonably warm conditions for the end of February and the first half of March. The other half of the vortex is over Western Europe and is having the opposite effect there. It is sending the region into a dangerous deep freeze for the next few weeks. This stratospheric warming event was very extreme, possibly setting records for how sharply temperatures spiked in the upper atmosphere and will allow for our temperatures to become 20 to 25 degrees warmer than normal. If you have a season ski pass, you may want to get all the use out of it now while you can, the deeper we go into March, and the less likely there will be snow.

Another sign that spring is here is the winter boat shows are over and Torresen's Spring Thaw is almost here (and many thanks to all the volunteers who worked the MYC booth at the GR boat show recently). Save the date of March 10th for some great deals on all the supplies & equipment you will need to get your boat ready for the water and some excellent free seminars taking place from 9 AM till 5 PM at Torresen's that day. We at MYC, can't thank Brian, Kathleen and their staff enough for all the support they and their late father Gordon, has continually given MYC over the years. Also coming in March, on the 17th our Social Committee's 2nd annual St. Patrick's Day Party at MYC. One of our local celebrities and fellow member, Bill Iddings, will be hosting Irish trivia & limerick contests with dancing to follow. Look like your kind of party? I'm sure you will be bummed out if you miss it.

We hope to see you here in March, and just in case, I'll be standing by to flip the breaker back on.

MYC Capstan



In response to some curiosity regarding the capstan, (the nautical artifact which rests in the dockside yard), I have some limited knowledge as to its origin and history.

According to the late Austin Freye, a member when the capstan was first brought to the club, "it was recovered by the shore, a short distance from the harbor of Duluth MN", by two former WWII U.S. Navy divers, Don Pyle, and John Bultema Sr.

Both were employed by Roy Love Marine Construction and Engineering Inc., out of Muskegon. Don, at the time, was Sea Scout master at MYC. John later founded the Bultema Dock and Dredge Company, and was active in founding the Grand Valley Water Research Center in Muskegon.

Austin said that they they were "surprised" to find the capstan where it was located, and that it hadn't already been recovered.

Roy Love Marine Engineering and Construction Company, at the time, was in the process of cleaning up wreckage off the entrance to the Duluth, MN harbor.

After being notified that the capstan was on display at the club, John Bultema Sr., not to be confused with his son, the late "Big John" Bultema, was interested enough to visit the club and "have a look". After studying the capstan over for a while, he recalled working at Duluth, "cleaning up wreckage and debris off the entrance". He remarked: "I remember working up there," and unfortunately, I don't recall recovering the capstan". He also said, "I surely would like to have it".

The first iron capstans appeared in 1850. This iron capstan is, for the most part, still functional. The pawl rim (base) of the capstan has the cast- in name of the manufacturer, Woodward & Coffin Boston and the serial number with some patent dates (1860s.)

The capstan was removed from the dockside yard in1985 during the first floating dock construction and stored in the Torresen sheds. It remained there, nearly forgotten, until 1999 when Commodore Steve Schiller had it brought it back to the club, refinished, and placed near the front entrance to the clubhouse. Thanks to Torresen Marine!

The "pigeon holes", in the capstan head, have been plugged to thwart litterbugs and smokers.

The original brass or bronze "capstan cover" is missing. A capstan cover usually displayed the name of the ship on which the capstan was installed. They are prized by souvenir hunters. A fabricated capstan cover has been installed on the capstan head, also to thwart litterbugs. 3 years ago, the capstan was moved from the front entrance, and is now on display in the dockside yard.


