COMMODORE'S COMMENTS:

"What an incredible place to race sailboats," said the old guy next to me on the MYC patio as we recently watched a Wednesday night race as boats beat past the outer dock. "You probably don't even know how good you have it here!"

Sometimes it takes a stranger – from a place called Katy, Texas, no less, to remind us of how lucky we are to sail on Muskegon Lake and live in this area. It was a drop-dead gorgeous Wednesday night as opposed to some of the previous weeks and my boat was still in the shed waiting bottom paint. MYC's Wednesday Night Race Series is the biggest series of sailboats racing at any yacht club on Lake Michigan, outside of Chicago. With five divisions- three PHRF spinnaker, one PHRF jib & main and a Melges 24 one design there's a division for every boat and everyone. "The series really accommodates every kind of sailor," explains longtime racer, Brad Alkema. "Depending on your boat and how intensely you want to race, you can find a division to race in." We have a mix of hot-shot racing boats and we've got cruising boats in the PHRF divisions but the races are so close, it's almost like one design racing. The Melges 24 fleet is really tough, competitive sailing. "Every leg and every tack is different, and I learn something new every time I go out there." "I never make the same mistake twice, but I make about ten new ones in every race," says Melges 24 skipper Eric Landman. "Everyone is friends on shore and at the club afterward but it's certainly one of the most competitive racing venues out on the water you will ever find" echoes longtime racer and Lake Lanier transplant, Bobby Cox. If you've never crewed or raced your own boat on a Wednesday night, I highly recommend it. Any club member that's interested in crewing opportunities this season or racing their own boat, please feel free to contact me. Also, I can't help but mention the special lure of Muskegon Lake on a midweek Wednesday evening. The powerboats are nowhere to be seen, there's no irritating power boat chop or motor rumblings, the lake is uncannily peaceful with usually just a few fishermen out. "It's a beautiful time to be on the lake," says my longtime crew member Kerri Bennett. After the racing is done for the evening and seeing the gorgeous sunset on the water makes you

feel like life is right." "It's never the same, the sunset is always different," explains Kerri.

Additionally, and very important, we have been blessed to have outstanding Race Committees over the years at MYC. This year and the past four seasons is no exception with Jon & Jessica Ledsworth volunteering their time to head-up our Race Committee. And there was a fifth transition year also when Peter Blacklock and the late Jim McColl helped train them. Jon & Jess have spent time in the off-season attending race seminars and certification classes to form the best race committee (and lovely couple) of any yacht club in the great lakes. Every racer appreciates the time they have given to the club and the "Thank You Race Committee!" is the traditional saying when you get the finish horn at the end of a race. I know it is sincerely felt, and said by this racer, and all racers at the club to Jon & Jess too.

Over Memorial Day weekend, we had a perfect storm of the pool opening and beautiful weather. Unfortunately, this caused many issues and complaints over the weekend. First, it was just plain overcrowded. Please remember that all member pool users must sign in and any non-member guests, per our red book, must be signed in and paid for at the pool. Also, no guest may use the MYC pool, or other MYC facilities, more than 3 times a year. This excludes small children being accompanied by an adult member. Please encourage any of your guests who love our pool to join the club.

Second, due to the overcrowding, glass containers on the pool deck, and other complaints from members, House Committee has unanimously voted to not allow coolers on the pool deck. It is our hope that this will help with many of the complaints and overcrowding. Please remember that glass containers have never been allowed at the pool, and please (re)familiarize yourself with pool rules in your red book.

Third, our amazing minimal kitchen staff was quite overwhelmed trying to find members outside while delivering food. It takes much too long for our staff to find members outside, so starting immediately, when you ask for food to be delivered outside you will be given a number to display. Please continue to be as descriptive as possible about your location, and display the number as conspicuous as possible so our staff can find you in a timely manner. Please note that your food will be delivered to the location of your number whether you're present or not, in order to keep our staff moving. Finally, please return the numbers to staff after your meal is complete and your table is bussed.

The House Committee is really trying not to overreact to the many complaints on our first great pool weekend. We always ask for our members to respect the rules and help us remind members who are not following them. Let's make this an awesome pool season together. WEST MICHIGAN YOUTH SAILING ASSOCIATION REGATTA at GULL LAKE



On June 29, the MYC Junior Race Team traveled to Gull Lake near Kalamazoo for the first of four WMYSA "Friday" regattas. At these regattas, both beginner and experienced sailors ages 7-18 gather in one place for the day to compete in separate fleets of Optimists, Butterflies, Lasers and Club 420s.

The Gull Lake WMYSA Regatta attracted 87 total boat entries and well over 100 youth sailors from nine different West Michigan youth sailing programs.

The MYC Junior Race Team had the third most boats registered for this event and, after the fleets completed four races, ended the day tied for 4th Place overall in total team points.

During the past couple of weeks, you may have noticed some extra helping hands around the club. This is because MYC has teamed up with Port City Consulting LLC, a program that allows students to gain meaningful work experience, while helping them determine what type of work they like. Port City Consulting is run by MYC member, Brenda Weiner, and she works in partnership with Michigan Rehabilitation Services. Brenda receives referrals from MRS, who funds the wages for the students and job coaches. PCC works with the MRS Counselors and students throughout the school year to help prepare these young students for their summer work experience. Brenda has around 60 students working at state parks, camp grounds, and other various businesses around Muskegon. This program not only helps these students build their resumes, but also gets them acclimated to a "work environment". Brenda approached me about the possibility of having some volunteer students work at MYC this summer and I couldn't be happier that we were able to make this happen!

We've been given the opportunity to work with 6 students and 1 job coach. They will be here Tuesday-Saturday from 10-2pm each week through August 10^{th} . In their first 2 weeks, they have accomplished quite a bit; from spreading mulch and raking the beach to the day-to-day cleaning of the inside and outside of club and grounds. Now that they've had a couple weeks to learn the ropes, I'm excited to expand their experiences with various projects, while still keeping the day-to-day routine cleaning and upkeep going. They have already been such a tremendous help and are an absolute joy to work with! If you see them around, please don't hesitate to say Hi and extend to them a warm MYC welcome!

Electric Shock Drowning

Electric shock drowning (ESD) is a very serious concern because there is no way you can see the danger. **No one should ever swim or dive in the water at MYC.** Boats and our docks can give off electrical current that is conducted through the water. Anyone in the water could potentially be electrocuted and drown. This is more common than you might realize and nearly every summer a person in the Great Lakes region dies from ESD.

With outer dock storm damage and high water expense issues looming this year, we've elected to hold off on redoing the whole parking lot for a couple more years. The repairs tuned out excellent and should add a few more years to the existing lot's lifespan.
