Greetings Fellow Members!

The final duty of the immediate Past Commodore is to preside over the nomination committee for the annual elections. This year, I was joined on the committee by current directors Jon Tasker, Jim Bach, and Kevin Moore, and club Secretary Eric Bomberry.

In any year, this is a very important responsibility as the club operations continue to grow but this year, given the extra challenges facing the club as we decide what to do with our marina in the face of our second major bout of storm damage, and the rising lake level, I feel it is especially critical that we have a knowledgeable and experienced board. We have some tough decisions to make and a relatively compressed timeline if we expect to have our marina back in full operation for next season. We are also faced with increasing labor cost with Michigan recently passing legislation that will increase the minimum wage to from the current \$9.25/hr. to \$12.00 /hr. This will force the ratcheting up of all our wage levels and will further challenge the finances of the club.

Given these facts, I am very pleased to report that most of our Board of Directors have agreed to stay in place for the coming year. The exception is Eric Bomberry who gave me the choice of staying as Secretary or Chair of the House Committee and after long discussions with Kim it was agreed that Eric is more valuable and harder to replace as Chair of the House Committee so Eric is stepping down from the board for a time to be able to focus on the House Committee and to spend some time as a Room Parent with his children entering school. We look forward to him returning to the board in the future. We are delighted to announce that Jessica Ledsworth has agreed to take over as board Secretary and look forward to having her bright shining face brightening up the board meetings!

Dean Runk agreed four years ago to take over as Treasurer from me. Being Treasurer of MYC is a difficult and often thankless job. Keeping the board operating within budget, operating as a collection agency for members behind on their club charges, spearheading the difficult budgeting process, and

constantly playing the role of the financial conscience of the membership and board is often not fun or popular but it is a critical job and gives you a tremendous level of knowledge and experience in all levels of operation of MYC. Dean has done outstanding work as Treasurer and the nominating committee is pleased that he has agreed to be nominated as Rear Commodore for the coming year.

Unfortunately, with the marina issue one of the projects that was tabled for the year was the amending of our bylaws to change our voting procedures and allow for electronic voting. It is high on the priority list for the coming year. That means that attendance at the Annual Meeting is still required in order to cast your vote for next year's board. The annual meeting is Friday October 19th at 7pm in the Lakeview room. I urge you to attend and I look forward to seeing you there as well as for the October 20th Haul Out day volunteer activities as we put the club to bed for the winter.

Juniors Committee Report:

WEST MICHIGAN YOUTH SAILING ASSOCIATION REGATTA at MAC BAY

On August 10, the MYC Junior Race Team traveled to Macatawa Bay Yacht Club for the fourth and final WMYSA "Friday" regatta of the 2018 season. A total of 89 boats and well over 100 sailors competed at this event.



In the **OPTIMIST GREEN** fleet of 20 boats, Emilee Nguyen placed 9th and Jasmine Nguyen finished 10th. Emilee and Jasmine are in blue shirts in the middle of the photo above. In the 28 boat **OPTIMIST RWB** fleet, Simon Frisinger placed 16th with his brother Hugh Frisinger right behind in 17th.



The **BUTTERFLY** fleet had 18 boats competing. Among the Top 10 finishers pictured above are MYC sailors Ben Morris in 5th, Gage Stasko in 6th and Ben Bakran in 10th. Dylan Young placed 16th and Ansel Hartmann finished 17th.

In the **LASER FULL RIG** fleet, Chance Spencer placed 3rd, Sarah Corder placed 4th and Josh Corder finished 5th.

2018 WEST MICHIGAN YOUTH SAILING ASSOCIATION SEASON RESULTS

At the Aug 10 WMYSA regatta at Macatawa Bay, the overall team results for the 2018 season were also announced. Similar to past years, the MYC Junior Race Team finished in 5th place overall out of the nine teams in the league.

The Final Overall Team Results for 2018 were as follows:

Saugatuck 339 points
Grand Rapids 250 points
Macatawa Bay 180 points
White Lake 159 points
Muskegon 131 points
Spring Lake 118 points
St Joseph 68 points
Gull Lake 18 points
South Haven 2 points

In addition to the overall team finishes, awards were presented to the top three scoring teams in each of the fleets. **For the third year in a row, MYC's Laser Full Rig sailors (shown below) brought home the 1st Place award** for scoring the most season points in their fleet. This marks the end of a very good run for MYC Laser Full Rig sailors Chance Spencer, Josh Corder and Sarah Corder (pictured below) who all graduated at the end of this season.



For the second year in a row, MYC's Butterfly sailors were the third highest scoring team in the West Michigan Youth Sailing Association. They even beat out Grand Rapids who are typically a very strong Butterfly team.

FALL HIGH SCHOOL SAILING IS IN FULL SWING!

The Midwest is currently the fastest growing region in the country for high school sailing. There are now 35 high school teams actively racing in Michigan! This means that nearly every weekend there are middle school and high school students competing on the water somewhere in Michigan.

On Sep 15-16, there were four different high school regattas taking place in different places around the state. At the St Joseph Invitational Regatta, sailors competed as 2 boat teams on 2 person Club 420 sailboats. MYC Junior instructor Frank Frisinger and the Grand Haven HS Sailing team (shown below) took 1st Place at this regatta sailed on the open waters of Lake Michigan.



One week later, on Sep. 22-23 on Macatawa Bay, Frank placed 9th out of 46 Laser Radial sailors at the Midwest Qualifier for the Cressy National High School Singlehanded Championship. The top three sailors at this event will now compete at the National Championship.

If you elect not to get on the slip waiting list, your choices for a slip in 2019 will be limited to whatever slips are left after the Slip Assignment Meeting, if any.

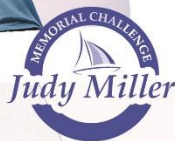
