COMMODORE'S COMMENTS:

Fellow MYC members,

It truly is an exciting time to be a member of MYC. With all the challenges and opportunities put before us our staff and members have proven up to the task. I hope everyone had a chance to taste the goodies at the volunteer appreciation desert bar...it was delicious.

The water continues to present challenges for us but we are working on plans to solve the issues. We have 2 new pilings installed on "B" dock and plans are in the works for spring repairs.

At our last Board meeting, after much deliberation, the board has decided to make necessary adjustments to the dues and CIF funds.

MYC, like every service organization, private club, and restaurant in the country is faced with a very challenging employment market and as such rapidly increasing labor cost. The current very low unemployment level is creating a "seller's market" for employees which has contributed to our employee turnover and is forcing us to raise our compensation levels in order to hire and retain employees. As a result of this and other contributing factors the board has deemed it necessary to enact the following dues adjustments:

Full Membership is now \$725.00

Associate Membership is now \$480.00

Junior Membership is now \$362.50

Our Capital Improvement fund (CIF) was created in 2013 to address the critical capital needs of Muskegon Yacht Club. The fund was created so that it impacted ALL members including Life members who are not required to pay dues. While perhaps the most visible aspects of the success of the CIF are the beautiful new pool fence and the major improvements to the windows in the bar, there have been many less visible upgrades to the facility. Some of the initial improvements were replacing and upgrading the roofs in our primary building to stop the pervasive leaks. This was followed by the acoustical ceiling in the Bar to reduce the noise levels and make that a more enjoyable environment. A beautiful new bar, Carpeting, tankless water heaters, new

siding and paint, air conditioning in the Lakeview and Spinnaker rooms, a new walk in cooler, kitchen expansion, fencing, junior ramp improvements, pool cover, and the ever popular “make up air” system. total nearly \$250,000 in repairs and improvements to MYC in the last six years.

Unfortunately, this has not been enough, and the high-water levels we are currently experiencing and which are projected to be even worse next year, are compounding the problems.

Currently we have many projects on deferral, some of them quite critical and the list just keeps getting longer. In round numbers:

- Window and wall rebuild (like in the bar) in Spinnaker room (Approximately \$30K)
- Windows in the Lakeview room (\$12K)
- Octagon Building (juniors’ classroom) roof (long deferred) (\$40K)
- Bath House roof and bath repairs (\$20K)
- Juniors Beach repair and long-term erosion solution (\$60K)
- Raise repair sea wall on lift side (\$40k)
- Replace sea wall fixed docks with floating docks (\$50k)
- Raise main dock (\$50K)
- Resurface parking lot (\$50k)
- Raise electrical service (already done) (\$16k)

While we are hopeful to package and accomplish some of the marina work as part of our repairs using the insurance proceeds, this list (which is far from all inclusive) quickly exceeds \$300,000 in projects that if not addressed, will simply continue to deteriorate and then will ultimately cost even more to address the longer they are deferred.

At a CIF funding level of \$120 per member, which generates approximately \$48,000 per year, we have existing, needed, known projects that will use over six years of current CIF funding. Of course, the reality is that over the next six years more expenses will come up and the cost of these repairs will also increase.

Bottom line, we need to raise more capital sooner to address these issues over the next couple of years instead of the next 6-10 years or we will be continually falling behind.

Larry Taunts recommendation to the board was and is to increase the CIF funding from \$120 to \$240 per member for a period of two years to get on top of our current capital demands and make these much-needed repairs and remodels to our facility.

Please don't shoot the messenger. I am not happy about this either, but I truly believe that the short-term pain of making this investment in our facilities now will pay us huge long-term dividends.

The board has decided to accept the recommendation and increase the CIF funding level, for a 2-year period, to \$20.00 per month or \$200.00 if paid in a lump sum.

Don't forget to come on down to the club for the holiday parties and decorations. Wishing each of you a very happy Holiday season!

Dock & Yard Committee Report:

Ready for Winter at MYC!

Dock and Yard has been busy preparing for the winter season. Most of the work this fall has been aimed at protecting slips from further damage as we prepare to rectify the attenuator issues in the spring.

Under recommendations from Edgewater Engineering, two pilings were driven into the lakebed off of "B dock" last week. In addition, all 26 bubblers were installed throughout the marina. These bubblers are on timers - so they don't run continually, saving the club energy dollars. Between the pilings and bubblers, we are hoping to assure less dock movement from wave and ice action over the winter.

Dock and Yard is extremely grateful to all of the members that volunteered to help install the bubblers! What could have taken many hours, took only a few.

Right now, Dock and Yard is working on the 2020 budget. There is a lot of work to do in the coming spring. Unfortunately, we are anticipating high water again next season, which is requiring some serious planning.

On October 5-6, Frank was the skipper for ODU's entry in the B Fleet at the Webb-Woollum Regatta in Newport News, Virginia. It was a busy weekend with both fleets completing 9 races on the James River and another 9 races on the Warwick River. Frank (*below on boat #6*) sailed to 1st Place in the B Fleet, helping ODU take 1st Place overall out of the nine college teams at this event.

On October 12-13, MYC and its junior sailing program were well-represented on the open waters of Long Island Sound at one of the premier events on the annual collegiate sailing calendar.

Since the early 1970's, Larchmont Yacht Club in New York has been the host venue for the **Storm Trysail Foundation Intercollegiate Offshore Regatta**.

Each year, this prestigious invitational regatta attracts approximately 50 of the best collegiate teams from around North America. Teams compete in a variety of one-design and PHRF fleets comprised of J105s, J109s, J111s, J44s, Farr 40s and other offshore yachts provided on-loan by East Coast boat owners.

Each year, Michigan State University hosts its annual **MSU Cedarfest Regatta** at the MSU Sailing Center on Lake Lansing. MYC members Scott and Lisa Corder served as the Race Committee for the 11 teams competing this year.



Despite cold temps and winds that eventually exceeded safe limits on day two, the sailors pictured above had a great time, which underscores why collegiate sailing is growing faster in the Midwest than anywhere else in North America.
