As spring draws near, it is a time for reflection and new beginnings. I ask that everyone remember the reason that you joined Muskegon Yacht Club. I know that for myself it was for the feeling of family, friendship, and the love of sailing. I have deep roots in our Club and the success of it means a great deal to me personally.

We all, members and staff, are weary from dealing with the pandemic and all of the restrictions and changes necessary for our club to remain open and for all to stay healthy. There have been a number of misconceptions as to why and who makes the decisions regarding COVID policy, and there has been some inharmonious behavior at MYC over the past year. I would like to address these issues.

The business model for MYC is known as "Staff Managed, Member Led." As stated in the MYC Member Handbook (the Red Book), "The Board of Directors and general membership sets the rules, policies, code of conduct, and general protocols for MYC. The staff is tasked with the administration of such. Some areas of the club are managed by volunteers, and this changes as committee chairs and leadership changes, depending on the activity level of the committee involved." All members are urged to be active in this process. It is the backbone of our Club.

We have heard your complaints and we have been working hard to improve your experience at MYC. Regarding seating at the bar, we have reached out to the Muskegon County Health Department to confirm that we have interpreted the Executive Orders correctly. The response that we received from the Environmental Health Officer who works with MYC is as follows: "Due to these social distancing requirements and limited staff, our original agreement was to forgo bar seating ... Under the current orders, I believe this solution is still

beneficial based on spacing and staff limitations." Therefore, seating at the bar will remain as is at this time. The House Committee will revisit this issue at our next meeting scheduled for Saturday, March 13, 2021.

This past weekend we had the unusual problem of not enough seating for all who wanted to enjoy MYC due to the 25% capacity mandate. I am very pleased to announce that Governor Whitmer held a press conference on Tuesday and announced "additional re-engagements for bars and restaurants." Effective Friday, March 5, the indoor dining capacity will increase to 50% and the curfew will be moved to 11 pm. We will implement some new seating options. These changes should provide enough seating for all who want to enjoy the beautiful views and what our club has to offer from all areas of our clubhouse.

Friendly reminder when cashing out and closing tabs: You may pay for your purchases with cash, check, credit card, or charge to your member account. As you would with a credit card slip, please sign out your member charge tabs at the end of each visit. This will ensure your checks are correct and attributed to the right member account. If you do happen to leave without signing your member charge slip, an 18% service charge will be added to your bill.

Any discrepancies with your bill must be settled at the time of service.

We are all anxious for life to return to normal as soon as possible. We will continue to do what is needed to get through these difficult times and come out better and stronger than ever at the end. To do so, we need to stay safe as we re-engage. Please wear a mask; wash your hands; and social distance.

I look forward to seeing you all at MYC this Spring!

COVID-19

MDHHS EPIDEMIC ORDER EFFECTIVE MARCH 5 THROUGH APRIL 19





Limits on attendance at residential gatherings.

- Face masks are required at all times, unless eating or drinking.
- Residents should follow MDHHS guidelines for safe social gatherings and are encouraged to form a "pod" of people to socialize with consistently.

INDOORS: UP TO 15 PERSONS FROM 3 HOUSEHOLDS OUTDOORS: UP TO 50 PERSONS



Limits on attendance at non-residential gatherings.

- Everyone must wear a face mask at all times, unless eating or drinking while seated in a
 designated area.
- Consumption of food or beverages is permitted only while seated in a designated area with a group of no more than 6 people.
- · While eating or drinking, each group must be at least 6 feet apart and may not intermingle.

INDOORS: UP TO 25 PERSONS OUTDOORS: UP TO 300 PERSONS

"Gathering" means any occurrence where two or more persons from more than one household are present in a shared space. Incidental gatherings (where people do not mingle with others outside their group) are excepted. For more information on gathering rules, please see the FAQs.



Face masks are still required.

Businesses, government offices, schools, child care organizations, operators of public transit, and all other gathering organizers must not allow indoor or outdoor gatherings of any kind unless they require individuals to wear a face mask. These entities may not assume that someone who enters the business without a face mask falls in one of the exceptions; but may accept an individual's verbal representation that they are not wearing a face mask because they fall within a specified exception.



Retail and personal services

- Gatherings at a retail setting, library or museum, may not exceed 50% of total occupancy limits
 established by the fire marshal. Spaces for indoor dining, including food courts, must comply with
 the requirements for food service establishments.
- Gatherings to receive personal care services, including hair, nail, tanning, massage, spa, tattoo, body art, and piercing services are permitted by appointment. Masks must be worn at all times except if a customer is receiving a medical or personal care service for which the removal of the face mask is necessary.



Recreation and entertainment

- The following recreation and entertainment venues are open for enjoyment by individuals or groups of
 up to 25 persons: auditoriums; arenas; cinemas; concert halls; performance venues; sporting venues;
 stadiums; theaters; archery ranges; amusement parks; arcades; bingo halls; bowling alleys; gun
 ranges; laser tag; and trampoline parks.
 - Indoor Facilities: must not exceed 50% of the limits established by the fire marshal, and must not
 exceed an overall total of 300 people.
 - Outdoor Facilities: must not exceed 50% of the limits established by the fire marshal (if applicable), and must not exceed an overall total of 1000 people.
 - Everyone must wear a face mask at all times, unless eating or drinking while seated in a designated area.
 - Consumption of food or beverages is permitted only while seated in a designated area with a group of no more than 6 people.
 - Groups must be spaced 6 feet apart.
 - Large Indoor Stadiums/Arenas: up to 375 patrons for large venues with a seating capacity up to 10,000 seats, and up to 750 patrons for large venues with a seating capacity up to 10,000 seats



Food service

- Indoor dining at restaurants and bars is permitted up to 50% normal seating capacity or 100 persons, whichever is less.
- Dining is only allowed until 11 p.m. and in designated dining areas where patrons are seated, groups
 of patrons do not exceed 6 people at a table, and each table is separated by at least 6 feet. This
 includes dining inside most covered patios, balconies, tents, and other structures, unless they are
 mostly open to the air. See the <u>Outdoor Seating Infographic</u> for more details.
- · Food service for takeout and delivery is permitted.
- Outdoor dining is permitted so long as no more than 6 persons are seated at each table and tables are spaced 6 feet apart.
- Dining in an igloo, hut, or small tent is permitted so long as there is only one group inside.



Exercise, fitness, and sports

- Exercise facilities: Gatherings are permitted both indoors and outdoors for individual exercise, group
 classes, and individual and group instruction. Exercise facilities include gymnasiums; fitness centers;
 exercise studios; tracks; sports complexes, pools, yoga, dance, gymnastics, and cycling studios; ice
 rinks: roller rinks: and trampoline parks.
 - Attendance must not exceed 30% of the total occupancy limits.
 - There must be at least 6 feet of distance between each occupied workout station
 - · Spaces and activities must be set up to maintain 6 feet between all persons at all times.
 - Masks are required, except for swimming.
- Capacity limits for ice and roller rinks must not exceed 10 persons per 1,000 square feet (approximately 175 people at once on a typically sized rink).
- Contact sports that can be played with a mask can proceed with practice and competition as of February 8. Where a sports organizer has deemed a type of sport to be unsafe to play while masked, all participants across the entire organization must be tested consistent with the testing protocol specified in MDHHS Interim Guidance for Athletics.



Wednesday Night Racing Series Scoring:

Season scoring will be based on individual "high point" overall scoring of the best twenty (20) Wednesday night finishes of the total twenty-four (24) scheduled from 5 May 2021 through 13 October 2021. First Warning is 6:30 PM until 2 September 2021 when the First Warning is 6:15 PM for the rest of the season. The fleet will obtain one (1) throw-out race for every six (6) races scored. For example, if nineteen (19) races are scored, then the fleet will receive three (3) throw-outs which can be applied to the nineteen (19) races scored. If the twenty-fourth (24) race is scored, the fleet will receive a fourth (4th) throw-out. The class winners and overall winner of the Wednesday Night Racing Series will be the boat(s) with the highest amount of points after the allowable throw-outs. One (1) race sailed shall constitute the summer series.

Wednesday Night Sponsor Series Scoring:

There will be four (4) separate Wednesday Night Sponsor Series. These races will be the first six (6) Wednesday nights followed by the following six (6), the next six (6) and the last six (6) Wednesday nights. Each Sponsor Series will be scored independent of the overall Wednesday Night Racing Series. If six (6) races are scored, each boat will receive one (1) throw-out. If less than six (6) races per series are scored, there shall be no throw-out. The class winners and overall winner of each Sponsor Series will be boat(s) with the highest amount of points after the allowable throw-out. One (1) race scored shall constitute a series.

Blacklock Cup Trophy Scoring:

The Blacklock Cup will be awarded for the Best Overall High Point score for the combined races marked above with a red *: MYC Commodores Cup, MYC Nedeau Cup, GRSC/MYC Commodores Invitational, and MYC Governor's Cup. There will not be a throw-out available for the Blacklock Cup Scoring.

Spring & Fall Challenge Scoring:

The Spring and Fall Challenge will continue to each be awarded as single events. In addition, they will count towards the Wednesday Night Racing Series and they will count towards the one (1) of two (2) of the Sponsor Series that they will fall in on the race schedule, unless either are abandoned.

Nedeau Cup:
