# COMMODORE'S COMMENTS:

### Women's History Month Highlight: Kimberly Blum

Women's History month was last month, but since it's technically still March as I write this, and because this dedicated woman deserves to be highlighted, here is a glimpse of the astonishing Kim Blum.

Kim is the devoted wife and mother of four children, Pam, Emily, Piper, and Cole. She joined MYC with her family in 2018. She and her husband were not initially engaged in club activities because they were not immediately welcomed by fellow MYC members. As is a common problem within private clubs, the "cliquish" nature can be a tough nut to crack, so to speak. I am looking in the mirror as I say this, but we must work harder at being more inclusive. The Blum's joined MYC so their family could learn to sail together. Thankfully, they finally met some of our more exuberant members, Scotty Miller and Mark Marchido. This connection and friendship anchored the Blum's continued involvement at MYC.

In 2020, Scott Corder stepped down from our Juniors program, and Kim graciously took over as the chairperson. Since that time, she has grown our youth program at MYC exponentially. Last year, MJSA enrolled over 90 students in sailing school, including 32 adults and 16 juniors on our new race team. The J/24, "School Bus," generously loaned to the junior race team by member Kyle Vowels, isn't the only program Kim has developed. She also implemented and executed the OPTIMIST S.A.I.L. program, or Self-confidence, Adventure, Independence, and Learning, which is an outreach program for youth in our community who wouldn't normally be afforded the opportunity to try their hand at sailing. This program began 2 years ago with Opti's placed in an indoor swimming pool, utilizing industrial fans to create wind. Both of these programs are truly amazing, as I have witnessed the beaming smiles on the kids' faces. During this time, Kim has also been a member of our house committee and our social committee chair.

Kim doesn't stop there. Her efforts extend beyond the walls and lakes around MYC, and her other areas of volunteerism are also worthy of mention. For 10 years, Kim served as a Director for the Allendale Region American Youth Soccer Organization (AYSO) and was primarily responsible for promotion, fundraising, and team logistical support. Through her fundraising, the Allendale AYSO was able to maintain an affordable soccer program for over 400 kids annually. These funds also provided for necessary soccer equipment

and most notedly, automated external defibrillators (AED) for the soccer fields. Kim was also the Director for the Allendale Engine House No. 5 Museum for over 10 years, where she was heavily involved in operations, fundraising, community outreach, and promotion of the museum. Kim's fundraising at the museum accounted for nearly \$80,000 in operational support! She was also the founder and organizer of Engine House No. 5 Stuff a Fire Truck Food and Essentials Drive, which recently completed its 6<sup>th</sup> year of providing for families in need through local food pantries. Kim is currently the Assistant District Governor of Rotary International Region 6290. Her role there is to help her assigned Rotary clubs develop and achieve district goals, and assist the District Governor with administrative duties. On top of all this, Kim also has a real job. She has been a Real Estate Agent with Coldwell Banker AJS Schmidt for 22 years now.

For Kim, there is no goal unattainable, or challenge too great. It's not just what Kim does for her community, but it's the unwavering integrity she exhibits in everything she does. Kim, your strength, drive, grace, and devotion are truly inspiring. I salute you!

Greetings fellow MYC members!

I am pleased to submit to you our consolidated 2023-2024 fiscal year budget that was recently approved by the Board of Directors as required by our bylaws each April.

You will note that we are projecting a few dollars deficit, but this is because we are budgeting an accelerated payoff of the remaining balance of the marina loan. As hopefully you recall, as I am sure you all study in detail each issue of the Portwatch, that we refinanced the loan in October as we had a balloon payment upcoming and we locked in a 5.5% interest rate with no balloon payment. At the end of this term the loan will be repaid in full. This is quite a milestone for us and we are going to work hard to pay this off in 5-6 years instead of 7 as it will put us in a much better financial position with the debt service load removed from the club. Our plan once that is accomplished is to build a substantial reserve fund for future marina repairs and replacement once the useful life of the marina is reached.

We do have some capital expenditures pending but as these are funded from the Capital Improvement Fund, they are not including in the budgeting process (CIF contributions are not budgeted as revenue either)

The club is currently on sound financial footing as we are heading into a more challenging economic environment. We have cash on hand, we have an outstanding staff, and we have an active and engaged board, and a growing membership.

I wanted to thank the Committee Chairs, General Manager Kim, the board of directors, and especially Business Manager Sue Peters for the many hours of work that goes into the budgeting process this and every year. It is truly a team effort with Sue doing most of the heavy lifting.

I am looking forward to another great season at MYC! If you have any questions about the budget or club finances, as always feel free to contact me directly.




SAVE THE DATE! The MYC party of the year is Saturday July 1st!

With Board approval Dock and Yard has initiated work to begin on several of the following maintenance issues at MYC:

 <u>Octagon Building</u> - Versatile Roofing Systems has been selected to complete the installation of the new roof membrane on the Octagon Building. They intend to begin work around the first of May.

- <u>Southeast corner of Melges lot concrete repair</u> Kloote Concrete has been selected to complete the replacement of the damaged concrete in the southeast corner of the Melges lot. This work will begin when temperatures remain above freezing.
- <u>Main entrance</u> Kloote Concrete will be removing the existing carpet covered concrete at the main entrance to the clubhouse. The new entrance will be finished with stamped concrete. This work will be performed in conjunction with the work in the southeast corner of the Melges lot.
- <u>Concrete seawall at Juniors launch</u> TR Ghezzi Marine Construction has been selected to repair the concrete seawall along the beach adjacent to where the Junior's floating dock is moored. This work is anticipated to begin in the next couple of weeks.
- <u>Clubhouse facia repair</u> Muskegon Quality Builders has been selected to repair the rotted facia on the southeast corner of the clubhouse. This work is anticipated to begin in the upcoming weeks.

Also keep note that the 84<sup>th</sup> Queen's Cup Regatta is finishing at MYC on July 1<sup>st</sup>. D&Y is anticipating a very full marina with competitor boats moored, rafted, and docked in as many places as possible. Dock and Yard will be requesting feedback from slip holders who will be traveling that weekend or who are willing to move their boat to a mooring ball so that we can accommodate as many racers as possible.


SELF CONFIDENCE. ADVENTURE. INDEPENDENCE. LEARNING

The Muskegon Yacht Club Sailing School recently hosted the Optimist S.A.I.L program, an exciting introduction to sailing, at the Muskegon Heights Public School Academy's Aquatic Center. The event saw the participation of children from the Boys and Girls Muskegon Lakeshore Club and Muskegon Heights Public School Academy's 5th and 6th grade students. Using Optimist sailboats and industrial fans to create wind, participants were able to sail the boats around the pool and learn the basics of sailing, while also learning about STEM principles.



Sailing is a complex and challenging sport that requires a solid understanding of science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) principles. The MYC Optimist S.A.I.L program not only introduced participants to sailing, but also how to apply STEM principles to the sport. Stations were set up to teach the children about knot tying, wind speed and direction, and buoyancy. These hands-on activities provided participants with a greater understanding of the physics and engineering behind sailing, and gave them the opportunity to apply these principles in a practical way.

The program's skilled volunteers were on hand to guide the children through the different stations, helping them to learn and apply STEM principles to the sport of sailing. Knot tying was a particular highlight, as participants were taught how to tie knots that are essential to the sport. The children learned how to tie basic knots like the bowline and figure-eight knot, as well as more advanced knots like the sheet bend and the clove hitch.



Wind speed and direction were also key areas of focus during the program. Participants were taught how to read wind direction and use it to their advantage while sailing. They learned how to adjust the sails and trim them to catch the wind and gain maximum speed. These skills are essential for any sailor, as they can make the difference between a good and a great sailing performance. Finally, buoyancy was another area of focus during the program. Participants learned about the physics of buoyancy and how it affects the stability of their boats while sailing. Using various materials, they learned how to adjust the weight distribution of their boats to improve their stability and prevent capsizing.

Overall, the MYC Optimist S.A.I.L program was a resounding success. Participants not only learned the basics of sailing, but also gained a greater understanding of STEM principles and how they apply to the sport. The program's hands-on activities and skilled instructors provided a fun and engaging learning experience for all involved. It is clear that the program has inspired a love of sailing in many of the children who participated, and it is sure to be a memorable experience that they will cherish for years to come.


