Simply fill out the customized payment form and submit! Your payment will be transferred directly from your bank account to MYC's bank account. There is no cost to you.

ACH stands for Automated Clearing House, a U.S. financial network used for electronic payments and money transfers. Also known as "Direct Payments," ACH payments are a way to transfer money from one bank account to another without using paper checks, credit card networks, wire transfers, or cash.

This service is available to us from ChoiceOne Bank and is powered by Autobooks...both are Michigan companies.

Beginning this month, you will find the link and QR code on your monthly statements, and on the MYC website (on the home page under "Quick Links"). Of course, we will continue to accept all other forms of payment (cash, checks, debit cards, Visa, Mastercard, American Express and Discover.) Our previously announced 3% surcharge on credit card transactions has not begun yet, but is coming soon and will be announced.

May was a month for projects. The concrete that was damaged by high water has been repaired, the front entrance aged concrete and carpet has been replaced by stamped concrete, the seawall along the beach has been repaired, and the roof to the Octagon building has been repaired.

And the projects continue. Currently volunteers are working on the shower rooms applying a 2-part epoxy paint to the walls below the tile in addition to what seems to be unending repairs to the water system for the docks.

And speaking of docks, Dock and Yard requests that slip holders take inventory of their dock lines and check the following:


- 1. At a minimum, boats should be secured with 3 strand dock line. For a somewhat stronger option use a double braid dock line.
- 2. Dock line sizing is one-eighth inch of line diameter for every 9 feet of boat length.
- 3. The use of snubbers in your dock line will reduce the shock load on the boat and dock cleats.

A dock line sizing chart is provided (More informatino can be found at www.westmarine.com):

Boat Length	Dock Line Dia.
Up to 27'	3/8"
28'-31'	7/16"
32'-36'	1/2"
37'–45'	5/8"
46'-54'	3/4"
55'-63'	7/8"
64'-72'	1"

Just as important as proper dock line sizing is how you tie your boat to the cleat. The Cleat Hitch is the best way to tie a boat to a dock.

If you intend to use your boat on Saturday, July 1st it is highly recommended to get your boat out of the marina Friday evening. As part of a new Portwatch series, I am interviewing all our Past Commodores to learn more about this great club and how it has changed and thrived all these years. This month I interviewed Dr. Mort Kantor.

Dr. Kantor joined MYC in 1964 and was elected Commodore in 1971. Mort said one of his greatest accomplishments was joining MYC. He chose MYC as his home away from home due to the proximity to his house. "It is right around the corner, so it is very convenient." Mort started out owning a powerboat that he and his family, including the dog, would take north for trips. When his daughters were small, they loved going up north. They all loved being on the water, including his late wife Macky, who he said was the "leader of the family."

Mort started his sailing career as crew on various boats, working his way to eventually becoming the skipper of the infamous "Chicken Soup." He bought Chicken Soup about 15 years after joining MYC. He remembers his friend Fred put a live chicken in the cabin of his boat. He said, "I laughed so hard but then told Fred, 'You have to get the chicken out of here, not me.'" He noted it was much easier to release the chicken into the cabin than it was to catch him. "Boy, that

was funny." Mort spent the next 25 years racing "Chicken Soup" at MYC.

Mort was the spearhead of one of the greatest summer amenities at MYC: the swimming pool! At that time, some of the members wanted a pool, and some did not. He started selling bonds to members to help fund the project to see how far he could get. Some bought \$25 bonds and some \$100. They were a little short on raising enough money near the end, so he recruited the help of Roger Anderson and Sherm Poppen. He said, "They made sure we had enough money." At that time Mort's extended family belonged to the Macatawa Bay Yacht Club and they were constructing a pool as well. He got a lot of advice and ideas from his family in Holland and brought those ideas to MYC. He said, "We had to elevate the pool due to high water problems. If we did not elevate it, it would float away." He was on site daily to make sure the project was under control. He said it took less than one year to fund and build, at a cost of approximately ten thousand dollars.

You will often find Mort at MYC enjoying a nice cold lemonade. He truly loves this place and has enjoyed watching it evolve into what it is now. He could not be prouder to call himself a Past Commodore of Muskegon Yacht Club. I asked Mort, "What advice would you give to our membership?" He responded, "Don't raise hell, and help in any way you can." I genuinely enjoyed speaking with him. He had so many wonderful things to say about this club and has always been a positive influence.

94th WMYA Championship Regatta

Muskegon Yacht Club Thursday August 3 – Sunday August 6, 2023

The Western Michigan Yachting Association was formed in December 1929 as a result of an informal agreement between representatives of the three original member clubs; the Spring Lake Yacht Club, the Muskegon Yacht Club and the White Lake Yacht Club. The driving force behind the organization was C.D.R. Mulder, who was a member of both WLYC and SLYC.

The fledgling association held their first regatta at Muskegon Lake in 1930 as a two-day event. The regatta included only three classes of boats: A Scows, C Scows and E Scows, and involved only a single race in each class. The Muskegon Lake Regatta was so successful that the three clubs decided to formalize their relationship and promote intense inter-club competition. All interested parties were invited to attend a luncheon at the Century Club in Muskegon on September 22, 1930. Delegates from White Lake, Muskegon Lake, Spring Lake and Black Lake (Macatawa Bay) were on hand. Within a short time, the Grand Rapids Yacht Club and the Torch Lake Yacht Club also joined. The organizers chose C.D.R. Mulder (SLYC) Commodore, William R. Munroe (MYC) Vice-Commodore, John G. Guerin (WLYC) Rear Commodore, Clarence E. Pitkin (WLYC) Secretary, and C.A. Crowe (MBYC) Treasurer. By 1938 Pentwater and Crystal Lake had also joined.

The White Lake Yacht Club invited the other members of the association to hold its. first official regatta at White Lake in August of 1931. Hoping to improve upon the earlier efforts at Muskegon Lake, the organizers of the White Lake Regatta decided to extend the event to three days (Saturday, Sunday, and Monday) and to have the three classes of boats sail in heats, one for each day of the event, which would supposedly

improve the competition. They also added a social side with Sailors Lunch every day and a grand ball to end the regatta.

During the 30. and 40.s the WMYA experimented with another type of regatta known as the Skippers Regatta. The idea was that each club would send a skipper and crew for each of the three classes (E, C, and Cresent). Each crew would rotate from one boat to another until each had sailed each boat, negating advantages of speed or quality on other boats. The winner was based on a point system with the winner having the most points overall. In 1936 the Association decided to let the host club provide all the competing boats. This posed a problem when not all clubs had all the fleets racing on their lake.

In 1939 a cruising boat race from Macatawa to White Lake opened the event and it was made an annual event for several years. During the war years of 1942 and 1943, the regattas were canceled due to war time travel restrictions and lack of competition. The format for the races remained fairly uniform over the years. Each regatta lasted for three days, changing to a Friday to Sunday format, and now to a four day format. The classes of boats raced over the years have included the: A Scow, E Scow, C Scow, Cresent, Y Flyer, Snipe, Lightning, Lawley, Scooter, Wood Pussy, Nipper, MC Scow, Butterfly, Laser, M20, and Melges 17. This Regatta Year Book started in 1959 as the first official program printed for the regatta and it was dedicated to Howard Tremble as a past WMYA Commodore. The position of Resident Agent (now Executive Secretary) began in 1962 with Tom Bloodgood. In 1966 Midge Verplank took over and held the association together with consistency and vitality until retiring in 2003, with Joan Manny replacing him.

To this day the foundation of the WMYA is based on encouraging, promoting, conducting, and supervising amateur yachting and yacht racing on the inland lakes. Its. long history has perpetuated through generations of sailing families and will continue to do so in to the future. -www.wmya.org
