

Simply fill out the customized payment form and submit! Your payment will be transferred directly from your bank account to MYC's bank account. There is no cost to you.

ACH stands for Automated Clearing House, a U.S. financial network used for electronic payments and money transfers. Also known as "Direct Payments," ACH payments are a way to transfer money from one bank account to another without using paper checks, credit card networks, wire transfers, or cash.

This service is available to us from ChoiceOne Bank and is powered by Autobooks...both are Michigan companies.

Beginning this month, you will find the link and QR code on your monthly statements, and on the MYC website (on the home page under "Quick Links"). Of course, we will continue to accept all other forms of payment (cash, checks, debit cards, Visa, Mastercard, American Express and Discover.) Our previously announced 3% surcharge on credit card transactions has not begun yet, but is coming soon and will be announced.

## Blacklock Cup Trophy Scoring:

The Blacklock Cup will be awarded for the Best Overall High Point score for the combined races marked above with a red \*: MYC Commodores Cup, MYC Nedeau Cup, GRSC/MYC Commodores Invitational, and MYC Governor's Cup. There will not be a throw-out available for the Blacklock Cup Scoring.

Shore power safety — while walking the docks it is not uncommon to find shore power cords in the water or shore power cords plugged in, breaker on, and not connected to a boat. Dock and Yard are now requiring that all shore power cords be rated suitable for Marine Use, or better still, "UL-Marine" listed for marine shore power applications.

Standard "outdoor use" extension cords to provide electrical shore power to the boat or any equipment, such as a battery charger on board the boat is not allowed. These cords are not rated for and are not suitable for the severity of a marine environment. They can deteriorate and/or overheat causing electrical shock, a short circuit, or a fire.

All shore power cords should have male (plug) and female (connector) ends of the locking type. Make sure that plugs and connector are turned to the fully locked position by pulling on them. If they are properly locked, they will not pull out. A plug or connector not properly locked will become loose and possibly cause arcing (sparks) on the contacts, resulting a failure and/or fire.

All male ends must be molded on or have weather-proof boots in order to provide a weatherproof seal when plugged into a receptacle.

All female connector ends must have a locking ring to secure the power cord to the inlet on the boat and provide a weatherproof seal.

Adapters should always be used at the shore end of a power cord.

Always make sure that the "Main" circuit breaker on the boat is turned "OFF" before connecting or disconnecting the shore power cord. Additionally, when departing your slip make sure that the shore power circuit breaker is turned "OFF". Should you forget it is MYC policy for dock hands to turn off breakers to any empty slip. So upon your return be aware that the shore power may be turned off.

Always connect the female end of the cord to the boat before plugging the male end into the shore power receptacle. Always disconnect the male end from the shore power receptacle before disconnecting the female end from the boat.

Never leave a shore power cord on the dock with only the plug end connected. A live cord end is dangerous, especially if it accidentally falls into the water.

Periodically check shore power cords for the following:

- Cuts, cracks, or severe abrasions on the yellow cord covering.
- Bent, broken, or loose plug blades.
- Plug blades or connector slots that show signs of overheating or arcing, such as:
- Brown or black discoloration on insulation around blades or slots.
- Discoloration and/or corrosion of blade material.
- Faulty locking rings due to cracking or damaged threads.


Do not allow cords to be pinched by a closed door or hatch. Pinch points create resistance and generate heat that can result in a fire.

Never coil a live cord tightly on the dock. Such a coil acts as a heat generator and can cause a fire. Hang the cord loosely on a hook or support, or lay it out in a loose coil of only a few turns.

# Queen's Cup "Reach to the Beach" Finish Wrap Up

132 boats competed in the 2023 Queen's Cup race from South Shore Yacht Club in Milwaukee Wisconsin to the Muskegon Yacht Club. Each boat was asked by SSYC to come to MYC and participate in the Finish Party but at a minimum they each needed to stop long enough to turn in score cards and trackers prior to heading to their home ports. The first boats arrived at MYC shortly after midnight and were greeted by our volunteer dock crew who tirelessly worked the night to assist in dockage of every boat. By daylight it was estimated that there were nearly 70 competitor boats in the marina. Thank you to the dock crew volunteers Josh Wallace, Jeff Allen, Mark Marchido, Ross Simpson, Clark Miller, Tim Wallace, and Tom Lamont who worked through the early morning until the last boat came in late

# 94th WMYA Championship Regatta



# **Muskegon Yacht Club**

Thursday August 3 – Sunday August 6, 2023

The Western Michigan Yachting Association was formed in December 1929

as a result of an informal agreement between representatives of the three original member clubs; the Spring Lake Yacht Club, the Muskegon Yacht Club and the White Lake Yacht Club. The driving force behind the organization was C.D.R. Mulder, who was a member of both WLYC and SLYC.

The fledgling association held their first regatta at Muskegon Lake in 1930 as a two-day event. The regatta included only three classes of boats: A Scows, C Scows and E Scows, and involved only a single race in each class. The Muskegon Lake Regatta was so successful that the three clubs decided to formalize their relationship and promote intense inter-club competition. All interested parties were invited to attend a luncheon at the Century Club in Muskegon on September 22, 1930. Delegates from White Lake, Muskegon Lake, Spring Lake and Black Lake (Macatawa Bay) were on hand. Within a short time, the Grand Rapids Yacht Club and the Torch Lake Yacht Club also joined. The organizers chose C.D.R. Mulder (SLYC) Commodore, William R. Munroe (MYC) Vice-Commodore, John G. Guerin (WLYC) Rear Commodore, Clarence E. Pitkin (WLYC) Secretary, and C.A. Crowe (MBYC) Treasurer. By 1938 Pentwater and Crystal Lake had also joined.

The White Lake Yacht Club invited the other members of the association to hold its. first official regatta at White Lake in August of 1931. Hoping to improve upon the earlier efforts at Muskegon Lake, the organizers of the White Lake Regatta decided to extend the event to three days (Saturday, Sunday, and Monday) and to have the three classes of boats sail in heats, one for each day of the event, which would supposedly improve the competition. They also added a social side with Sailors Lunch every day and a grand ball to end the regatta.

During the 30. and 40.s the WMYA experimented with another type of regatta known as the Skippers Regatta. The idea was that each club would send a skipper and crew for each of the three classes (E, C, and Cresent). Each crew would rotate from one boat to another until each had sailed each boat, negating advantages of speed or quality on other boats. The winner was based on a point system with the winner having the most points overall. In 1936 the Association decided to let the host club provide all the competing boats. This posed a problem when not all clubs had all the fleets racing on their lake.

In 1939 a cruising boat race from Macatawa to White Lake opened the event and it was made an annual event for several years. During the war years of 1942 and 1943, the regattas were canceled due to war time travel restrictions and lack of competition. The format for the races remained fairly uniform over the years. Each regatta lasted for three days, changing to a Friday to Sunday format, and now to a four day format. The classes of boats raced over the years have included the; A Scow, E Scow, C Scow, Cresent, Y Flyer, Snipe, Lightning, Lawley, Scooter, Wood Pussy, Nipper, MC Scow, Butterfly, Laser, M20, and Melges 17. This Regatta Year Book started in 1959 as the first official program printed for the regatta and it was dedicated to Howard Tremble as a past WMYA Commodore. The position of Resident Agent (now Executive Secretary) began in 1962 with Tom Bloodgood. In 1966 Midge Verplank took over and held the association together with consistency and vitality until retiring in 2003, with Joan Manny replacing him

To this day the foundation of the WMYA is based on encouraging, promoting, conducting, and supervising amateur yachting and yacht racing on the inland lakes. Its. long history has perpetuated through generations of sailing families and will continue to do so in to the future.




