# COMMODORE'S COMMENTS:

#### Spotlight: MYC Junior Sailors, Coaches, and Instructors

Over the next couple of months, I'd like to call attention to some of our exuberant youth who are doing admirable things within the sailing community and right here at Muskegon Yacht Club. I've asked each of them to share with me a little about themselves, such as, how they became sailors, what their plans are for the upcoming year, and what they're learning in their new roles as teachers and coaches.

Jazmine Nguyen, who launched into her new role as a Muskegon Juniors Sailing Association (MJSA) Instructor, also launched into sailing back in 2017 when she enrolled in our beginner learn to sail class. Only three days later, she was competing in her first regatta with the MYC Junior

race team. She says her favorite part of this job, as both an instructor and coach for the race team, is "seeing the bright smiles of kids having fun on the water." The



most challenging aspect is when the weather is too treacherous for the kids to be on the water, but she knows so well, "safety always comes first." Her advice for next year's instructors is to "have fun with the kids, tell stories about your sailing experiences to inspire them so one day they come back, or in the future their kids come back." Jazmine will be starting her senior year this fall at Oakridge High School with dual enrollment at Muskegon Community

College to begin her studies in business. She will also be playing Varsity soccer, clarinet in the marching band, saxophone in honors jazz band, and sideline cheerleading. She is the daughter of our enduring General Manager, Kim Nguyen, and father, Sonny Nguyen.

Cole Blum started sailing on his parents' Catalina when he was only a toddler. He enrolled in MYC sailing school and Junior race team roughly the same time as Jazmine, 7 years ago. This is also Cole's first year as a coach for the race team and MJSA instructor. His favorite thing about coaching is "getting to mentor young kids who love sailing, who fully dive into the sailing waters and will give it their all." He also works hard to help students with the

occasional scary or stressful situation, saying, "I put myself in their shoes and help them overcome their fears...and keep them safe and comfortable." This also coincides with his suggestion for the next group of sailing school instructors. which was to "keep your head up and really put yourself in the kids shoes...be friends with the kids." Cole will be entering Allendale High School



as a freshman this fall, and will be playing on the basketball team. Cole raced in his 2nd Chicago Yacht Club Race to Mackinac (CYCRTM) this year on the boat Flight Risk. He says he enjoys "the family you create within your team." Cole is the son of our Dock & Yard Chair and Rear Commodore, Jeff Blum, and the MYC Sailing School


Chairperson and Rotary Assistant District Governor, Kim Blum.



ACH stands for Automated Clearing House, a U.S. financial network used for electronic payments and money transfers. Also known as "Direct Payments," ACH payments are a way to transfer money from one bank account to another without using paper checks, credit card networks, wire transfers, or cash.

This service is available to us from ChoiceOne Bank and is powered by Autobooks...both are Michigan companies.

Beginning this month, you will find the link and QR code on your monthly statements, and on the MYC website (on the home page under "Quick Links"). Of course, we will continue to accept all other forms of payment (cash, checks, debit cards, Visa, Mastercard, American Express and Discover.) Our previously announced 3% surcharge on credit card

# **Race and Regatta Committee Report:**

The Tuesday and Wednesday Night Series Races have been well attended during July with some spectacular racing taking place. The July 12th Wednesday Race was one to remember as a torrential rainfall hit the fleet, soaking all! A great race! Thanks again to our Race Committee Team for their hard work!

The Chicago to Mackinac Race is in the books and Past Commodores Steve Schiller and Eric Wynsma each won their sections. Eric's win was extremely impressive as his amateur status crew was able to win the professionally dominated TP 52 class.

The 2023 Jolly Roger Yacht Club Team Championship was a super fun regatta this year. 24 boats from the three yacht clubs, MYC, White Lake YC, and Lakeshore Yacht Harbor YC raced from White Lake Channel Pier to Muskegon Channel Pier in a brisk SW wind and lumpy seas on Lake Michigan. The 14.5 nm course included a buoy 4 nm west of White Lake Channel Pier. This year the fleet competed in two divisions, a cruising class (16 boats-5 from MYC) and a performance class (8 boats-3 from MYC). Unfortunately, the conditions were such that the performance class boats did not get to use their spinnakers, so they were jib and main just like the cruising class. In the Cruising Class, 1st place went to Sirenia (MYC), skipper Bruce Spencer; 2nd place to Falcon (LSYH YC), skipper Greg Vandenberg; and 3rd place to Wolly Bully (MYC), skipper Gary Marchido. In the new Performance Class, 1st place went to Ricochet (MYC), skipper Jeremy Cox; 2nd place to Caitlyn Christine (LSYH YC), Skipper Cliff Rinkle; and 3rd to Ping! (WLYC), skipper Chris Penn. In the yacht club team competition, the Cruising Class for the Jolly Roger Cup was a tie between MYC and WLYC. Sirenia (1), Wolly Bully (3), and Fenna Rose (11) for 15 points tied

with Tradition (4), Atlantis (5), and Menagre (6) for 15 points. The inaugural Performance Plague went to MYC with Ricochet (1) and Passpartout, (4) for 5 points. The skippers meeting Friday evening at White Lake Yacht Club was well attended with several MYC boats overnighting. Lakeshore Yacht Harbor Yacht Club put on a terrific awards banquet with a Caribbean theme, rum punch and beer. A good time was enjoyed by all. The Jolly Roger Cup will remain at MYC for a ½ year and then go to WLYC for the balance of the year. Next year we would love to see more boats from MYC compete to bring the cup back to MYC!

Lots of great sailing coming up in August with the Western Michigan Yachting Association's 94th Championship Regatta being held at the Club on August 3-6 which will bring in over 150 boats. Classes include Optimist Prams, Butterflys, Lasers, MC Scows, C Scows, and E scows. WMYA Commodore Mark Burns and his committee have been working hard to prepare for this popular Regatta.

Following that will be the Lake Michigan Clipper Cup which will be racing their 37th annual on Friday, August 11th. Jointly hosted by the Muskegon Yacht Club and the Port Washington Yacht Club, it is 66.9 nautical miles of a fun family race! Partial proceeds from the race are used to support the junior sailing program each year.

#### **Dock and Yard Committee Report**

This has been a very busy season for our marina. The Queen's Cup has come and gone, the WMYSA Friday Junior Regatta has come and gone, and by the time you read this the Western Michigan Yachting Association Regatta (Westerns) will have just taken place. Next up, the Clipper Cup. This is starting to sound like a race and regatta committee report but that is not my intention. All these regattas bring boats, boats with trailers, and people to MYC which impacts the normal operations and membership access to the facility. These events not only support MYC but they also support the growth of sailing. Thank you all for your patience as you struggle to find a parking space or find that the marina is full of boats everywhere or must wait in line for a beer. So, when you become frustrated with the crowded situation, please just remember to Enjoy the Wait and Smile as it will get over soon!

Moving on from the pep talk, the finger dock for slip 70/71 has been an ongoing issue for several years. In the spring of 2021 Dock and Yard rebuilt the dock that had been severely damaged from the high water only to have it fail again this summer. The question that became a long struggle was "how do you span 36-feet from shore to piling and have a dock that will support weight, not fall in the water, or bend or warp?" Well, most structural engineers' responses were "you don't, it's too long of a span without a center piling". Dock and Yard did not like that answer so we teamed up with T.R. Ghezzi Marine to find a solution. Recently, Ghezzi Marine installed a new dock for slip 70/71 that was able to span 36-feet and maintain structural integrity. Dock and Yard will also continue working with Ghezzi Marine to discuss future innovations that can be made to the seawall slips to continue



making improvements. A goal being considered is to make these docks floating. We shall see what the future brings.

#### Dock and Yard wishes to also share with you a few Red Book reminders:

- Members tied up at any of the docks at the Club on Fridays,
   Saturdays, or Sundays may not have dinghies or inflatables in tow,
   since they occupy valuable dock space. Dinghies or inflatables are
   permitted only in rented slips if they don't obstruct the fairway.
   (Dinghies should be tied up in your slip so that they also do not
   obstruct the neighboring boat's ability to enter or leave their slip).
- All dinghies, boats, and trailers stored on MYC property are required to have a legible Club supplied sticker conspicuously displayed.
   Unless otherwise approved, storing a dinghy along any dock is not permitted (unless you are a slip owner storing your dinghy in your slip in front of your boat).
- Unleashed or unattended animals are not permitted on Club property.
   Members must clean up after their pets. All pets must be on a leash when on MYC property. Pets are not allowed to enter any part of the Club House and are not permitted on the patio.
- Fishing is only permitted on the fixed outer dock facing south and away from the marina. Children should be supervised by an adult.
   Dock and Yard also wish to remind everyone that fishing is not permitted from the junior docks or any other docks inside the marina.
   Also, dead fish must be disposed of properly.

Should you wish to get involved the Dock & Yard meets the second Saturday of every month at 9am at the club. Everyone is welcome to attend the meetings.



I am thrilled to share that it has been another great season for the sailing school thus far. 


We have introduced a STEM curriculum this year and have created a workbook for each child to use throughout the week and take home. It includes additional activities that they can complete at home or in class if there are weather delays that prevent them from getting on the water. I would like to give you a look at a typical week in our beginner class as well as an excerpt

from the workbook explaining lift. I hope you enjoy reading about the incredible experiences and achievements of our students throughout the season.




How do boats actually move? How do you explain this to a beginner youth sailor? Our average age of our student is between 8 and 11 years old.



Imagine how amazing it would be to fly on the water, and that's exactly what lift does. With the help of the wind and special sails, sailboats can sail against the wind and go wherever their adventures take them.

Let's imagine you're holding a piece of paper and blowing on it. Did you notice how it rises up in the air? That's because of lift! Sailboats have special sails that are shaped like wings, just like birds or airplanes.


A Sailboat gets lift from the wind like an Airplane:



When the wind blows across the curved sail, it makes the air go faster on one side and slower on the other.

This difference in speed creates a magical force called lift.

Similar to an Airplane a Sailboat has wings. What are they?




Lift is like a helping hand from the wind that pushes the sailboat forward, making it zoom across the water like a super-

speedy fish!

But wait, there's even more to lift! Sailors can do amazing tricks using lift. They can make the boat turn and go in different directions, even if the wind is blowing right at them! It's like a secret power.

They do this by moving the sails and changing their angle, just like you tilt a kite to make it soar high in the sky. This is called *tacking*. With a little twist here and a pull there, the sailors can make the boat zigzag and race against the wind like super sailors!



Sailing is a magical adventure where you get to feel the wind in your hair and ride the waves. Lift is the secret ingredient that makes it all possible.

So, the next time you see a sailboat on the water, remember that it's not just floating, but actually flying with the help of lift!

You are on your way to becoming a sailor and mastering the art of harnessing the wind to explore new horizons.

Set sail, young adventurers, and let lift carry you on exciting journeys across the vast blue waters!

It was my pleasure to sit and chat with Past Commodore Joe Schiller this month. Mr. Schiller was appointed Commodore for MYC in 1972. He has lived a very short distance from MYC since 1958 when he bought his lot and built his house.

Past Commodore Schiller had tons of memories to share with me during our short visit. Back in the 70's, MYC was stocked with scows and international 210 wooden boats. Joe owned a wooden boat himself – a 30 Square Meter – that once sank at MYC due to the planks shrinking. The Club, at that time, had to hire a crane to lift boats out of the water and they used it to lift his boat off the bottom. Once out of the water it was usable again as it soaked up water and made the planks swell to seal the holes. At the time, wooden boats had a short life and were subject to dry rot. Once fiberglass boats were developed it was a game changer for MYC. Fiberglass boats did not rot, or required much maintenance, but were very pricey back then. Joe helped transform the MYC dock system to help accommodate these new boats as slips became high demand. The steel sheet piling wall in the front of the Club was built under Joe's direction. It cost about \$200.00 for a seasonal slip at MYC in 1972.

Mr. Schiller created and ran the first MYC sailing school where Paul Wickland was one of his first students for juniors sailing lessons. Later he made buoys and racing flags, and was the race committee every Saturday morning for over 10 years hosting junior races on Muskegon Lake. He even allowed the kids to park their boats on his beach in front of his house. He bought his son, Past Commodore Steve Schiller, his first butterfly boat in 1964.

One of his most memorable races was the fun "Balloon Race." A committee would scatter balloons across Muskegon Lake after dark and see how many

each boat could retrieve in a certain amount of time. Whoever picked up the most balloons, won. This was a night race and was discontinued when safety became a priority.

As for the clubhouse and operations, Joe shared with me the process they used to vote on new member applications. He stated there was a wooden box stocked with white and black marbles with a trap door in the back. The box was passed around to all members. If a member did not want to accept that application, he would push a black marble to the trap door. Once everyone had a chance, they would count the marbles. If there were two (or more) black marbles in the trapped area that application was denied and they would have to reapply. Draft beers were 25¢ and a popular beer to serve was Schlitz. There was an active social committee that hosted fresh lobster, spaghetti, and shrimp dinners as well as a New Year's Eve party & Commodores Ball.

Mr. Schiller is also the keeper of the famous capstan that is located near the seawall. It was found by divers in Lake Superior around 1940 then stored at Torresen Marine with Gordon Torresen for a few years. Joes' friend, Austin Freye, knew the history of it and asked Joe if he wanted it for MYC. He accepted it and placed it in the front of the building. Since then, it has been moved here and there but has always been on MYC property since 1972. Just two short years ago, Joe asked his daughter to give it a fresh coat of red, white, and blue paint.

Joe's first boat was a 30 Square Meter wooden boat, later purchasing the original "Souvenir" (Morgan 30) in 1968, then the current "Souvenir" (PT32) in 1975. Joe placed 1st in his section during the 1978 Chicago/Mac race (John D. Kinsey Memorial Trophy) as well as being 1st overall in the Queens Cup race in 1976.

I asked Mr. Schiller, "What advice would you give to our current membership?" He stated, maintain the club as best as possible. His long time wish for MYC is to build a permanent break wall for the marina. He believes it will create more room and be more attractive for boaters all around.

Thank you to Past Commodore Schiller for inviting me into your home, our time together, and for giving me the inside scoop of MYC in 1972.
