

The prorated amount will be equal to 1/12 of annual appliable membership dues multiplied by the number of remaining months at the time of the application.





Greetings fellow MYC Members!

We recently held the "Annual Membership Meeting" where I gave a financial report for MYC. For those who were not able to attend I will provide a brief overview of the report.

Overall, the club is on solid financial footing. We have a reasonable cash balance, and our operations are running approximately on budget. Sales have finally begun to approach pre-pandemic levels.

Per Sue Peters we broke an important milestone in the debt service of the marina note in that our most recent monthly payment applied over \$10,000 to principle for the first time! We are making extra payments on the note currently with a projected payoff of the balance sometime in 2028. Our current balance on the note is approximately \$650k from our original balance of \$1.5 million. We were able to lock in a low 5% interest rate in late 2022 for the remainder of the term with no balloon payment. We are working to a loan payoff and will not need to refinance again.

The board at my initiation had a spirited debate about the 2023-2024 dues and Capital Improvement Fund (CIF) levels. The board majority approved an increase in full member dues from \$875 to \$925 however this vote requires a super majority to approve, and the proposed increase failed. The proposed increase of the CIF to \$15 per month or a lump sum of \$150 was unanimously approved by the board.

As treasurer I am disappointed that the dues increase was not approved. This amounts to an increase of \$4.16 per month coupled with the CIF increase this would have been a \$6.24 per month total increase. Given the sharp increase in our cost, especially labor cost, in the current economic environment, we may have to make some difficult decisions in the upcoming budgeting process. Operational hours, staffing levels, pricing formulas, and services will all have to be examined closely as many of our expenses such as taxes, utilities, cost of goods, are beyond our control. Nobody likes dues increases but if we want to maintain our level of services to our members, they are an unfortunate fact of life. To my mind not approving incremental dues increases simply kicks the can down the road resulting in a larger, even less popular increase in the future.

The Capital Improvement Fund, since introduced, has allowed MYC to rebuild, repair, and upgrade our facilities tremendously. Our roofs and windows no longer leak, our building heating and cooling systems have been upgraded, our bar is renovated, our entrance doors have been replaced, our pool deck vastly improved and more. Unfortunately, we still have much more to do. Our patio awning has seen better days as has our shade areas at the pool. Our parking lot needs a complete rebuild and resurface. We still struggle for storage and office space, our kitchen is still in need of cooling to improve our working conditions, our restrooms need updating. Now that the Octagon building is dry, further repairs and improvements are needed there. We have an old building that requires constant attention to maintain.

Our GM Kim, Business manager Sue, and Facilities Manager Nicky, along with their staff continue to provide us with an outstanding product and services. Our membership level is near all-time high levels. Our Full membership IS at all-time high levels, our club continues to operate in a fiscally responsible manner and as such our finances are strong.

This month I had the opportunity to sit and chat with Past Commodore Larry Larsen. Mr. Larsen was born and raised in Muskegon. He joined MYC in 1972 and was elected Commodore in 1987.

Past Commodore Larsen hung around MYC in the late 60's, sailing and swimming. Austin Freye was Larry's biggest influencer & mentor when it came to sailing. He encouraged Larry to join MYC, which he did in 1972, making MYC his home for competitive sailing. 80% of Larry's sailing career has been on one-design boats as he was never really interested in cruising. He has competed in the Westerns, Blue Chip, and Hobie National regattas, just to mention a few, throughout his 53 + years of sailing. MYC's membership was about 80% sailing and 20% social at that time with many opportunities to crew, up to four days a week. The winters were slow, with many just waiting for that spring day to get back out on the water.

During our short time together, Larry shared numerous stories with me, one of which made me laugh. The story begins with Larry and member Keek Wickland meeting at MYC for appetizers and drinks one Friday night. This was during the time that members could bring in their own proteins and cook it up on the grills that were located by the coffee station in the southwest corner of the bar area. On feature that night from the club manager was oysters. So, they placed an order, grabbed some drinks, and sat down for a night of stories and comradery. Their order was delivered and "boy they were good." So good that they placed another order, and another, and another. After a few rounds of oysters, they asked where they came from, thinking they were eating platters of fresh oysters all night. It was explained to them that Etterman's Supermarket (located in Lakeside at the time) sold containers of shucked oysters and the manager was placing the meat on the shells herself. They could not contain their laughter once they found out and still laugh about it today. He also shared with me that he was the first Commodore to break the Commodore's dress code at the annual Commodore Reception by wearing Bermuda shorts instead of dress pants. Some people frowned but quickly got over it.

I asked Past Commodore Larsen, "what challenges did you face during your time at the helm?" He responded with "dock issues." However, those issues helped Larry develop better leadership skills as it exposed him to other people in the club, which created lifelong friendships in return.

After one rowdy board meeting, Larry purchased a copy of "Roberts Rules" to help him understand and facilitate meetings better. Back then, they would lock the door to the board meetings so they would not be interrupted. "You either stayed in the bar or went to the meeting, not both." He also indicated the atmosphere at meetings (and in general) is much calmer now than it was back then. He gives the drinking laws and health awareness credit for that.

My last question for Past Commodore Larsen was, "What advice would you give to our membership?" He responded, "Stay involved – get involved...it is very rewarding."

In the summer you will find Past Commodore Larsen in Muskegon enjoying our natural resources and volunteering his time. In the winter, he can be found in Costa Rica surfing, a sport that he has done longer than sailing.

Thank you, Larry, for your time and stories. It was my pleasure speaking with you and learning more about MYC in 1987. Safe travels this winter!


